Quick Facts:

- Benton County is among the top 5% of counties with the highest income inequality in the United States
- 70% of Monroe K-3 students and 67% of Alsea 4th and 5th graders are economically disadvantaged
- 30.2% of individuals of Hispanic or Latino origin fall below poverty level
- Over 16% of Benton County residents live in households that are food insecure

* PARTICIPATION IN HEALTHY FAMILIES, DECEMBER 2014

- ➤ 10-20 families are screened each month.
- ➤ 6 families are served from rural Benton county, plus 2 pending.
- > 23% of families served are from rural Benton County

✤ JACKSON STREET YOUTH SHELTER, 2016-2017

- ► 1,036 youth were helped across all programs
- > 807 youth received help on streets, in schools and through community partners
- ► 138 youth were served for a total of 6,073 bed nights
- ➤ 11 youth accessed long-term housing and support to achieve their goals

✤ <u>PARTICIPATION IN OLD MILL RELIEF NURSERY</u>

- > 2014: 21 rural family participants (33% of total families)
- > 2015: 28 rural family participants (28% of total families)
- > 2016: 32 rural family participants (28% of total families)
- > 2017: 30 rural family participants (25% of total families)

* INEQUALITY AND HOUSING COSTS

- ➤ Highest income inequality in the state; among highest 2% of all counties in the US
 - 80th income percentile is 4.7 times the 20th income percentile
- ➤ Living below federal poverty line: 22%
- ➤ Median household income: \$62,077**
- ➤ Median cost of childcare (2014) as a percentage of annual income (2011-2015): 25%
- ➤ Homeless count 2017: 287
 - Sheltered count: 139
 - Unsheltered count: 148
- ➤ Pregnant women served by WIC: 32%

✤ <u>POVERTY*</u>

- ➤ 14.0% of children under 18 years of age below poverty level
- ➤ 36.0% of single parent-mother families fall below poverty

✤ <u>FOOD SECURITY</u>

- Over 16% (14,000) of Benton County residents live in households that meet the definition of being food insecure*
- ➤ Children eligible for free and reduced lunch: 38.0%*
- ► 4,476 receive SNAP benefits*
 - 13% of households
 - 37% with children under 18
- > 9% of low-income population lives more than a mile from nearest grocery store
 - Residents of North, South, and West Benton County report traveling 30 minutes or more to a grocery store**

* LINN-BENTON FOOD SHARE, 2015 - 2016

- ➤ Distributed 5.4 million pounds to their 74 member agencies in 2016
- > Provided enough meals to feed nearly 2,500 people three meals a day for the whole year
- Emergency food pantries in Linn and Benton counties distributed 47,000 food boxes from July 2015- June 2016
- Soup kitchens and shelters served 272,000 meals in Linn and Benton Counties during the fiscal year of 2015/2016

✤ <u>COMMUNITY HEALTH</u>

- ➤ Insurance*:
 - 7.3 % of 18-64 year olds are uninsured
 - 1.8 % of youth under the age of 18 are uninsured
- ➤ Immunizations*:
 - 65.0% of two-year olds meet immunization requirements
- ➤ Obesity*:
 - 8th graders: 14% overweight; 7% obese
 - 11th graders: 9% overweight; 7% obese
 - Adults: 32% overweight; 22% obese

✤ <u>EMPLOYMENT</u>

- ➤ Oregon unemployment rate: 4.1% as of December 2017**
- ➤ Benton County unemployment rate: 3.1% as of December 2017**
- ➤ Linn County unemployment rate: 4.4 % as of December 2017**
- Benton County manufacturing employment in decline since Great Recession (2.3% loss in 2015)
 - More than 3 out of 10 manufacturing jobs have disappeared since 2007

♦ CARDV BENTON/LINN COUNTY 2015-2016

- Responded to 5,686 calls to our 24-hour hotline
- Sheltered 102 adults and 88 children for 3,037 bed nights
- Helped 1,182 adults and 13 teens help navigate the legal system
- Provided on-site hospital advocacy to 147 adults and 24 teens

✤ MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

- ➤ In Benton County, 40% of adolescents insured through the Oregon Health Plan receive treatment for a mental health condition*
- There are about 23 deaths by suicide per 100,000 community members over the age of 45 each year*
- ➤ Attempted Suicide Rates**:
 - Grade 8: 7.8%
 - Grade 11: 5%
- ➤ Depression**:
 - 8th graders: 26%
 - 11th graders: 23.2%
