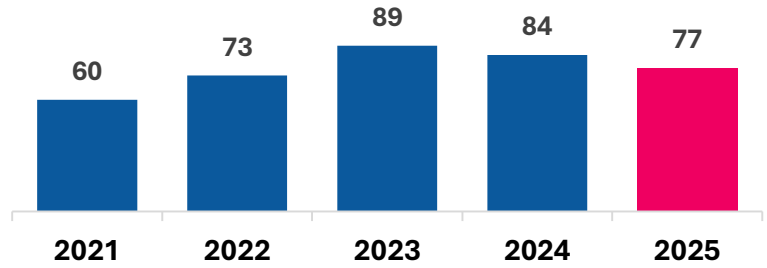
Families, Staff, & Visits

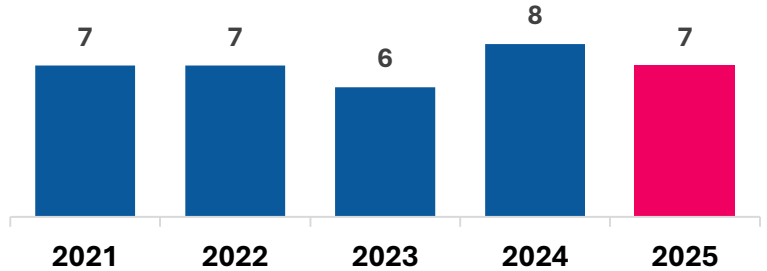
Number of Families

who received 1 or more home visits

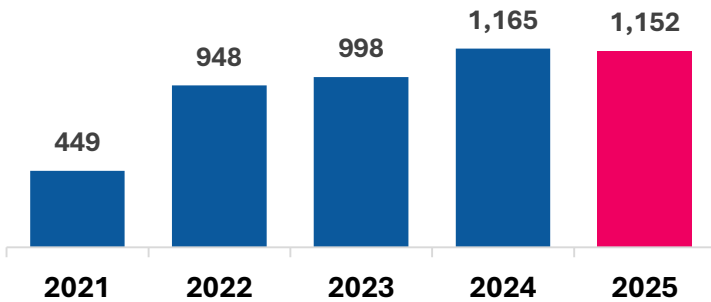


Number of Direct Service Staff

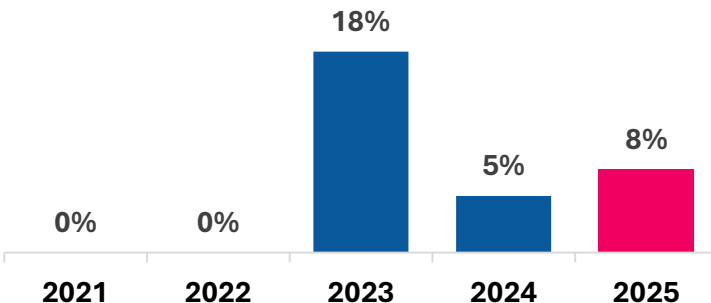

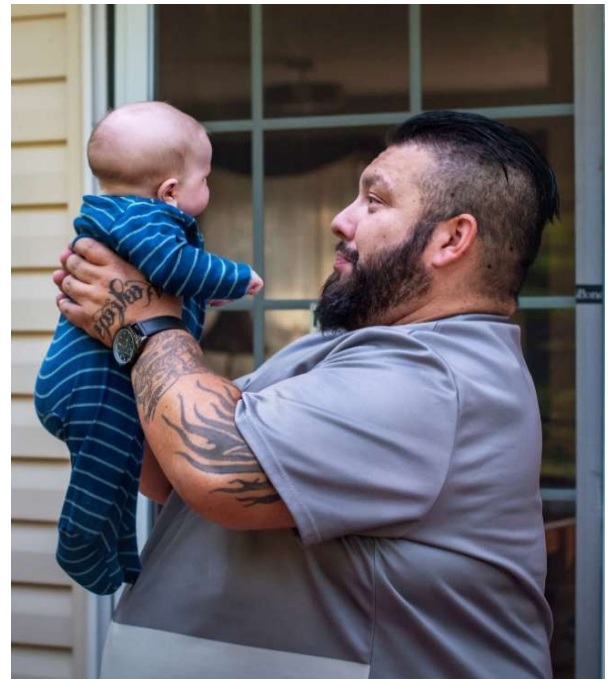
Number of Home Visits



Percent of Home Visits that were Virtual



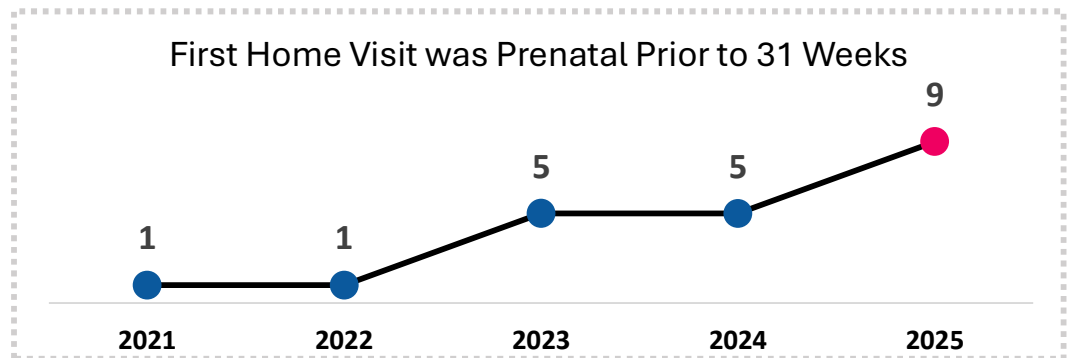
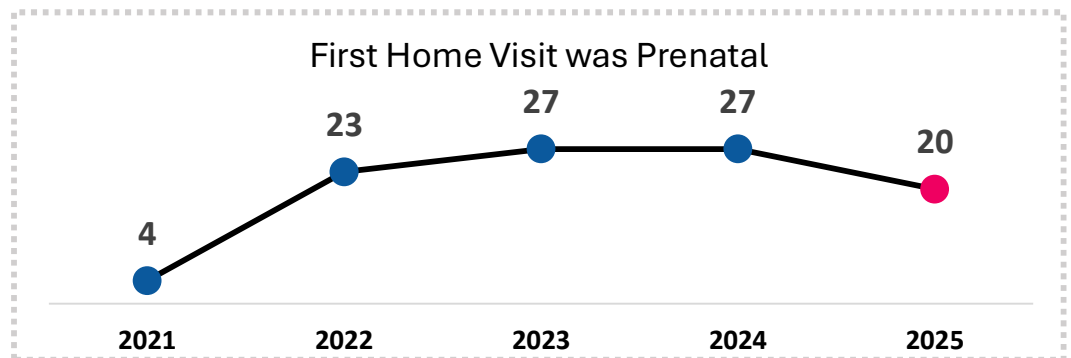
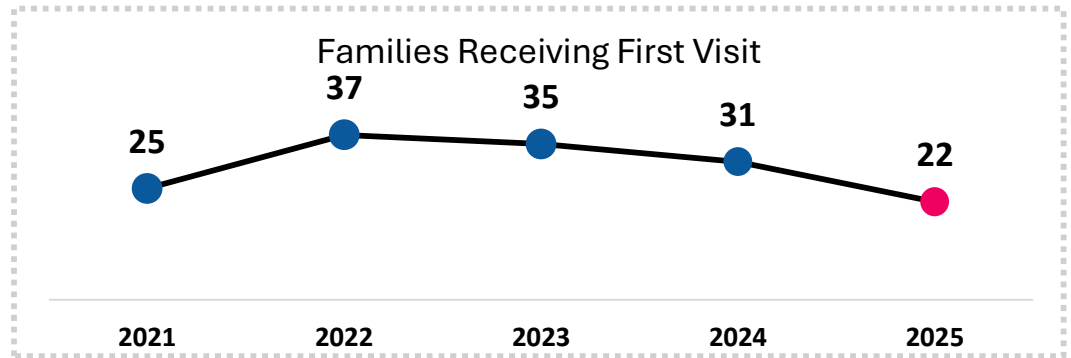
66% of families had fathers involved in the home visits



Newly Enrolled Families

The earlier families are enrolled during pregnancy the greater the opportunity to support healthy practices during pregnancy which can lead to improved birth outcomes and longer term parent and infant health.

When enrolled in the newborn period (0-3 months), parents can be supported with consistent, responsive, nurturing caregiving practices early in the infant's development, helping to ensure a secure attachment relationship.

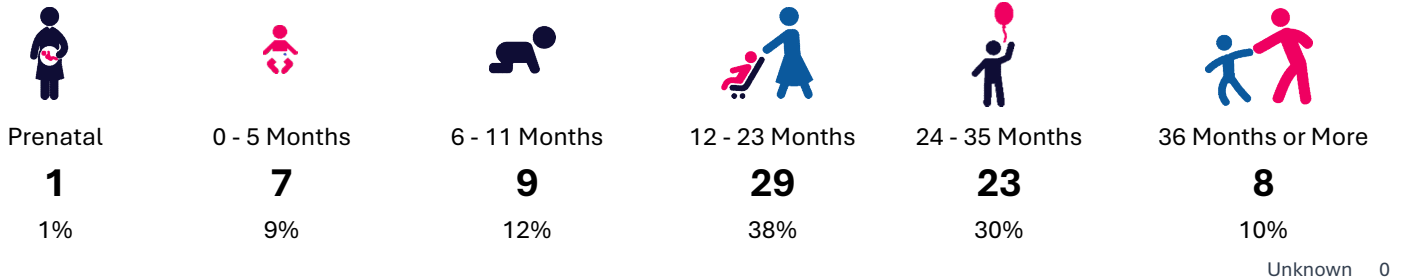
