Child Abuse and Neglect:

- > 76 cases/87 victims/108 offenses in Corvallis City Limits*
- > 55 cases/ 62 victims/91 offenses in the rest of Benton County *
- ➤ Benton County abuse and neglect rates: 6.4/1,000; Oregon abuse rates: 11.1/1,000**

***** Health Care/Community Health:

- ➤ Insurance*:
 - 12% of 18-64 year olds 6% of youth under the age of 18 are uninsured
- ➤ Immunizations**:
 - 60.8% of two-year olds meet immunization requirements
- ➤ Obesity*:
 - 8th graders: 12% overweight; 7% obese
 - 11th graders: 13% overweight; 8% obese
 - Adults: 35% overweight; 21% obese

❖ Enrollment in Head Start Pre-K Program February, 2014:

- > 76 in Corvallis at OSU Child Development Lab
- ➤ 38 Head Start/17 Early Head Start at Corvallis KidCo Head Start
- ➤ 19 at Philomath KidCo Head Start
- ➤ 17 at Harrisburg KidCo Head Start (serving Monroe and Bellfountain)

❖ Students Eligible for Free/Reduced Lunch 2013-2014*:

Corvallis: 10%
 Philomath: 12.5%
 Monroe: 15.67%

Participation in Healthy Families Program as of December 2014:

- ➤ 10-20 families are screened each month.
- ➤ 6 families are served from rural Benton county, plus 2 pending.
- ➤ 23% of families served are from rural Benton County

❖ Jackson Street Youth Shelter (2013-2014)

- > 990 youth were helped across all programs
- ➤ 482 youth received help on streets, in schools and through community partners
- ➤ 62 youth were served for a total of 1,135 bed nights
- ➤ 8 youth accessed long-term housing and support to achieve their goals

❖ Participation in Old Mill Center Relief Nursery*:

- ➤ 2011: 14 rural family participants (25% of total families)
- ➤ 2012: 19 rural family participants (19% of total families)
- ➤ 2013: 19 rural family participants (21% of total families)
- ➤ 2014: 21 rural family participants (33% of total families)

❖ Participation in WIC program as of February 2015*:

- ➤ Alsea: 14 families/22 clients
- ➤ Blodgett: 6 families/7 clients
- Corvallis: 638 families/980 clients
- Philomath: 107 families/175 clients
 North Albany: 33 families/51 clients
- ➤ Monroe: 37 clients/55 clients

***** WIC 2014

- > 35% of all pregnant women in this county are served by WIC
- > 2,396 women, infants, and children participated in WIC
- > 1,707 infants and children under the age of 5
- ➤ 689 pregnant, breastfeeding and post-partum women
- > 962 WIC families served (67% working families)

***** Housing and Childcare Costs*:

- Median Housing Costs (2012): \$1,088 \$1,628
 - 62.4% of renters and 35.3% of homeowners have housing cost burden (housing costs >30% of income) (2011)
- ➤ In 2009, approximately 154 total individuals accessed shelter services in Benton County were homeless

Poverty:

- ➤ 23.1% of all people's incomes fall below poverty level*
- ➤ 32.7 of single parent-mother families fall below poverty level*
- ➤ 1/3 of residents live below 185% of poverty level
- ➤ 975 families/9,166 individuals below poverty level in urban areas**
- > 1,547 families/8,837 individuals below poverty level in rural areas***

***** Food Security

- ➤ Over 14% (12,480) of Benton County residents live in households that meet the definition of being food insecure
- ➤ 21.7% of Benton County's children.
- > 9% of low-income population lives more than a mile from nearest grocery store
 - Residents of southern Benton County report traveling 30 minutes or more to a grocery store

❖ Linn Benton Food Share, 2015

- O Distributed 5,325,088 pounds to their 74 member agencies from July 1, 2013-June 30, 2014
- Emergency food pantries in Linn and Benton counties distributed 52,051 food boxes from July 1, 2013- June 30, 2014
- Soup kitchens and shelters served 272,075 meals in Linn and Benton Counties during the fiscal year of 2013/2014

***** Employment

- ➤ Unemployment rates have decreased 24% since its peak in 2009
- ➤ 2011: unemployment rates in Benton County were at 6.5%
 - 2011, unemployment rate in Oregon was at 9.5%
- > 58.2% of Benton County's population over 16 is employed
 - Oregon's rate is at 59.3%

ARDV Benton/Linn County 2012-2013:

- Responded to 7,178 calls to our 24-hour hotline (40% increase from 2011-2012)
- Sheltered 125 adults and 91 children for 3,240 bed nights
- Helped 594 adults and 11 teens help navigate the legal system
- Provided on-site hospital advocacy to 70 adults and teens
- Facilitated 52 support group meetings, with childcare provided
- Logged over 19,000 miles responding and transporting survivors

Rates of domestic violence in 2009:

- ➤ 67 at Corvallis Police Department
- > 56 at Benton County Sheriff's Office
- ➤ 20 incidences and 5 arrests at Philomath Police Department in 2014

❖ Mental and Behavioral Health*:

- ➤ In Benton County 2,186 persons between ages 16 and 64 are living with an identified mental health disability
- ➤ Suicide Rates: Ages 25-44, 18.5% (slightly higher than state average)
 - 11th graders, 7.2% have attempted suicide
- > Depression:
 - 8th graders: 15%
 - 11th graders: 16.8%
